Exciting news! The Berkshire Music School will be offering 8 FREE ukulele lessons to Richmond Consolidated School 4th - 6th grade students after school on Mondays from 3:10-3:55 at the school. The lessons will be conducted in a small group setting. Therefore, due to the nature of the instruction, the group will be limited to the first 10 students who sign up. Admission will be decided on a <u>first come</u>, <u>first served</u> basis. **This project has been supported by a grant from the Richmond Education Enrichment Fund (REEF)** of the Berkshire Taconic Community Foundation and the Richmond Cultural Council, a local agency which is supported by the Mass Cultural Council, a state agency.
