On Tuesday we sent home an important notice about a new testing opportunity and important changes to how we respond to COVID-19 cases. RCS will be participating in the at home testing program. Your participation in this program is optional, but we encourage all families to participate. If you have not signed up for this program, and would like to do so, please use this

Our participation in this program brings forward the following changes:

- This program begins the week of February 7th.
- The Test and Stay program must be discontinued and we will no longer be conducting contact tracing per DPH/DESE protocols.
- This will eliminate the requirement that students, who may have been close contacts at school, quarantine.
- We will continue to do our weekly COVID safety checks on Thursdays.
- We will continue symptomatic testing based on the current protocols.





Dear Parents and Guardians:

Exciting news! The Berkshire Music School will be offering 8 FREE ukulele lessons to Richmond Consolidated School 4th - 6th grade students after school on Mondays from 3:10-3:55 at the school. The lessons will be conducted in a small group setting. Therefore, due to the nature of the instruction, the group will be limited to the first 10 students who sign up. Admission will be decided on a <u>first come</u>, <u>first served</u> basis. This project has been supported by a grant from the Richmond Education Enrichment Fund (REEF) of the Berkshire Taconic Community Foundation and the Richmond Cultural Council, a local agency which is supported by the Mass Cultural Council, a state agency.

De-escalation is the reduction in the intensity of a conflict. Unlike escalation, which often occurs rapidly and unintentionally, de-escalation tends to be slow and only happens intentionally through much effort. This workshop will explore multiple approaches to support caregivers and children.

By evaluating the phrases children are being told daily, parents and care providers understand the impact of their words. This workshop looks at ten common expressions adults use with kids. Discovering language flaws and finding ways to better express ourselves supports healthy relationships with children. Avoiding the pitfalls in communicating with children is the primary focus of this exciting session.

**Each night we will raffle off a collection of Scholastic books! If you attend the workshop your name will be entered into the raffle and the winner will be announced at the end of each workshop!



Dear Parent/Guardian,

Keeping your students safe and in school is our top priority at RCS. We are writing to let you know, in accordance with the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE) and the Department of Public Health (DPH), our district is updating our COVID-19 Testing Program. We are opting into an at-home testing program that will increase testing of our participating students and staff, regardless of vaccination status. For more information about this update to the statewide testing program, please click here. The at-home testing option will begin during the week of February 7^{th.} In addition to this new at-home antigen test option, we will continue with routine COVID safety checks and symptomatic testing during the week. As part of this shift in the program, we are discontinuing Test and Stay and contact tracing for in-school close contacts. This means that if your child is a potential contact in school, they may continue to come to school and do not have to quarantine. This new at-home testing opportunity is voluntary and only those who opt-in will receive tests. We strongly encourage you to fill out the form today to opt-in. If you have questions, please contact the school's nurse.

Overview: At-Home Rapid Testing Program

About the Test: iHealth is a 15-minute at-home FDA-approved rapid antigen test


- Opt-In: To participate, you must opt in by completing the opt in form. By opting in, you will agree to review the training materials for test administration, report positive test results to your student's school, and administer the tests according to RCS's guidelines.
- **Weekly**: Every two weeks you will receive an iHealth at-home rapid test kit. Each kit contains two individual tests. Your student will administer one test each week on Monday morning.

Reporting Positive Test Results: If your student tests positive on an at-home antigen test, you will inform their school of the positive result by emailing our school nurse at clen-fest@richmondconsolidated.org. The school will keep the results confidential and will not make individual results public. In addition, it is strongly recommended that you inform your healthcare professional of the positive result.

Easy, Free, and Flexible: This test is administered at home (not at school), reducing the burden on school staff and time to administer tests and increasing a family's flexibility to do testing in the home for free.

• Submit Results: You must submit positive test results to your student's school. Please email the school nurse at clenfest@richmondconsolidated.org[
Confidentiality: Positive test results are shared with your school district for informational purposes only. Individual results will remain confidential, and they will never be made public.
